CARGO TRAFFIC HANDLED AT MAJOR PORTS DURING AND UP TO OCTOBER, 2023

Total Cargo traffic at India's Major Ports

Maritime transport activity is driven by developments in world economy, viz, growth in world output and trade. Thus, volume of seaborne cargo traffic handled by ports is mainly shaped by the levels and changes in both the global and domestic activity. Cargo traffic at India's 12 major ports during **April-October**, 2023-24, increased by 4.0% to 463.98 million tonnes from 446.14 million tonnes cargo handled during April-October, 2022-23.

The Overseas cargo handled at Major Ports increased by 4.1% from 344.19 million tonnes during April- October, 2022-23 to 358.36 Million tonnes handled during April- October, 2023-24. The Coastal Cargo handled at Major port also increased by 3.6% from 101.95 million tonnes during April- October, 2022-23 to 105.62 million tonnes handled during April- October, 2023-24.

Port-wise Cargo traffic handled during October, 2023

Cargo handled at India's major ports during October, 2023 is 70.46 million tonnes showing a increase of 13.9% as compared to the corresponding period of the previous year. The coastal cargo handled at Major Ports during October, 2023 increased by 8.6% from 13.98 million tonnes in October, 2022 to 15.18 million tonnes during October, 2023. The overseas cargo handled at Major Ports increased by 15.5% from 47.86 million tonnes in October, 2022 to 55.28 million tonnes during October, 2023.


- During October, 2023; Mormugao Port recorded the highest growth of traffic handled i.e. 98.7% followed by Cochin Port (60.3%), Vizag Port (35.3), VOC Port (32.9%), SMP Kolkata Dock System (23.9%), Chennai Port (20.6%), Paradip Port (12.5%), NMPA (10.4%), JNPA (9.4%), Kamarajar Port (8.3%), SMP Haldia Dock Complex (6.8%), Mumbai Port (0.1%). The Major port which recorded negative growth in October, 2023 is Deendayal Port (3.6%).
- Amongst the 12 major ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum cargo traffic of 11.69 million tonnes with a share of 16.6% in the total cargo handled at Major Ports followed by Paradip Port (15.7%), JNPA (10.6%), Vizag Port (10.2%), Mumbai Port (7.6%), Chennai Port (6.9%), SMP Haldia Dock Complex (6.1%), NMPA (5.6%), VOC Port (5.5%), Kamarajar Port (5.3%), Cochin Port (4.8%), Mormugao Port (2.9%) and SMP Kolkata Dock System (2.1%).
- At a broad commodity level, Iron-ore/Pellets achieved highest growth of 92.3 % in October, 2023 followed by Other Ores (85.1%), Project Cargo (75%), Fertilizer (51.9%),

Other Coal (32%), Iron & Steel (28.4%) Containers (18.7%), Pulses (15.7%), POL Products (15.5%), POL-Crude (14.7%), FRM-Dry (9.3%), Thermal Coal (7.4%), Sugar (6.8%), LPG or LNG (5%). Food Grains excluding Pulses recorded highest negative growth of 97.1% in October, 2023 followed by FRM-Liquid (23.6%) Coking Coal (19.8%), Edible Oil (19.3%), Cement (9%) and Other Commodities (6.3%).

At a broad commodity level, Containers handled the maximum cargo traffic of 15.79 Million tonnes in October, 2023 with a share of 22.4% followed by POL-Crude (20%), Thermal Coal (14.2%), Other commodities (9.1%), POL-Products(7.7%), Ironore/Pellets(7.3%), Other coal (5.9%), Coking coal (3.6%), LPG/LNG (2.1%), Fertilizer (1.5%), FRM-Dry (1.3%), Iron & Steel (1.3%), Edible Oil (1.2%), Other ores (0.9%), FRM-Liquid (0.6%), Cement (0.4%), Sugar (0.4%), Project Cargo (0.16%), Pulses (0.04%) and Food grains excluding Pulses (0.01%).

Cargo traffic handled during April- October, 2023-24

- During April- October, 2023-24, Mormugao Port recorded highest growth of 13.4% in traffic handled at Major Ports followed by SMP Kolkata (9.9%), Paradip Port (9.0%), Cochin Port (7.8%), Chennai Port (7.0%), Mumbai Port (7.0%), Vizag Port (6.7%), VOC Port (6.7%), NMPA (6.3%), JNPA (5.6%), Kamarajar Port (2.6%), SMP Haldia Dock (1.1%). Major Ports that recorded negative growth in traffic is Deendayal Port (7.7%) during April-October, 2023-24 over April- October, 2022-23 (Table A).
- Amongst the Major Ports, Paradip Port handled the maximum Cargo of 80.21 million tonnes with a share of 17.3% followed by Deendayal Port (16.5%), JNPA (10.7%), Vizag Port (10.1%), Mumbai Port (8.3%), Chennai Port (6.5%), SMP Haldia Dock (5.9%), Kamarajar Port (5.7%), NMPA (5.2%), VOC Port (5.1%), Cochin Port (4.4%), Mormugao Port (2.3%), and SMP Kolkata (2.1%) during April- October, 2023-24 (Graph- I below).

- At a broad commodity level, Pulses recorded the highest growth in traffic during April-October, 2023-24 at 50.2% followed by Iron Ore pellets/fine (38.7%), Fertilizer (20.7%), FRM-Dry (11.3%), Iron & Steel (10.2%), Container (9.1%), Edible Oil (7.0%), POL-Crude (6.0%), Other Ores (4.8%), POL-Products (2.9%), Project cargo (2.2%), LPG/LNG (0.6%) and Thermal Coal (0.4%). Foodgrain excluding Pulses recorded the highest negative growth of 80.4% followed by Cement 15.9%, Sugar 12%, Other Commodities 6.6%, Coking Coal 6.2%, Other Coal 3% and FRM-Liquid (0.9%), over April- October, 2022-23 (Table B).
- Amongst all the commodities, Container handled the maximum cargo of 106.26 million tonnes with a share of 22.9% followed by POL-Crude (20.9%), Thermal coal (13.8%), Others commodities (8.7%), POL Products (7.5%), Iron ore/Pellets (6.6%), Other coal (5.1%), Coking coal (4.6%), LPG/LNG (2.0%), Edible oil (1.6%), Iron & Steel (1.2%), FRM Dry (1.2%), Fertilizer (1.1%), Other Ores (1.1%), FRM liquid (0.8%), Cement (0.3%) Sugar (0.3%), Food grains excluding Pulses (0.2%), Pulses (0.1%) and Project Cargo (0.1%) during April-October, 2023-24.



Overseas and Coastal Cargo traffic handled during April-October, 2023-24

Amongst the Major Ports, Deendayal Port handled the maximum Overseas Cargo of 67.79 million tonnes with a share of 18.9 % followed by JNPA (13.1%), Paradip Port (13.1%), Vizag Port (10.3%), Chennai Port (7.5%), Mumbai Port (7.0%), SMP Haldia Dock (7.0%), NMPA (5.0%), Kamarajar Port (4.6%), VOC Port (4.6%), Cochin Port (3.7%), SMP Kolkata Dock (2.6%) and Mormugao Port (2.4%) during April- October, 2023-24 (Graph II).



• Amongst the Major Ports, Paradip Port handled the maximum Coastal Cargo of 33.29 million tonnes with a share of 31.5% followed by Mumbai Port (12.6%), Vizag Port (9.4%), Kamarajar Port (9.1%), Deendayal Port (8.4%), Cochin Port (6.9%), VOC Port (6.7%), NMPA (5.8%), Chennai Port (3.0%), JNPA (2.5%), SMP Haldia Dock (2.0%), Mormugao Port (1.9%) and SMP Kolkata (0.3%) during April- October, 2023-24 (Graph-III).
